Unpaywall

Access to an open and free version of articles published in paid scientific journals.

Google Scholar Button

Direct access to Google Scholar from any website. Select an article title on any web page and find it with a single click. Note that it often retrieves documents protected by copyright laws and licensing contracts.

Open Access Button

Obtain an open and free version of an article. If you don't find it, the operating system contacts the author to request a copy.

EndNote Click (Formerly Kopernio)

Access to the best PDF version of an article. Kopernio searches for institutional subscriptions, for open access versions of the editor, and, finally for repositories. It is integrated with the Web of Science, Google Scholar and PubMed, among other websites.

BASE

Specialised database with more than 120 million documents and over 6,000 different sources of academic resources.



CORE

Aggregator of more than 130 million of articles in open repositories and journals worldwide.
